“EXHIBIT A” SHARED PARENTAL RESPONSIBILITY

1. Pursuant to Florida Statute regarding Shared Parental Responsibility, both parents shall retain full parental rights and responsibilities with respect to their child/ren, and shall confer with each other so that major decisions affecting the welfare of the child/ren will be determined jointly. Such decisions include, but are not limited to education, discipline, religion, health, and the general upbringing of the child/ren.
2. Each parent shall have access to records and information pertaining the child/ren, including but not limited to, medical, dental, and school records.
3. Both parents are entitled to participate in and attend special activities or events in which the child/ren are involved. These include: school programs, sports events, religious and social activities, and any other extra-curricular activities. Parents are to notify each other of these events in a timely manner.
4. Each parent shall exercise, in the utmost good faith, his and her best efforts- at all times- to foster love and affection between parent and child/ren. They agree to not speak in a derogatory manner about the other parent or allow any other person to do so in the presence of the child/ren. Further, they shall not alienate the child/ren from the other parent in any manner.
5. For the sake of the child/ren parents shall demonstrate mutual courtesy and respect toward each other.
6. In the event of an accident of illness either parent shall promptly share all information available with the other. In cases of emergency requiring immediate action, the parent who is supervising the child/ren has the authority to give consent for treatment in the other parent's absence.
7. Each parent shall provide telephone access between the child/ren and the other parent.
8. The parents agree to keep the other advised of his or her current address and telephone numbers at all times. Additionally, as much as is practical, each will attempt to keep the other advised of his or her whereabouts on extended absences so that contact can be made if an emergency exists.
9. Neither parent shall conceal the whereabouts of the child/ren and each shall keep the other advised at all times of the address and phone number where the child/ren will be staying while with the other parent.
10. Each parent shall make the other aware of the name, address, and telephone number of all daycare and healthcare providers
11. During their time with the child/ren, each parent shall have the right to follow his/her own style of child rearing and discipline without unreasonable interference from the other parent. The parent supervising the child/ren will have the responsibility to make routine decisions, on a daily basis, unless otherwise stated.
